




## Ontario Tree Identification

Name	Description	Picture
<p><b>ASH</b> -White ash -Red/green ash -Black ash</p>	<p>Branches and leaves grow in an opposite pattern. Leaves are typically 5 to 15 cm long and compound with 5 to 11 leaflets. Leaflets have either smooth or toothed margins. Young trees have smooth, light gray bark. Older trees have furrowed bark with a diamond shaped ridge pattern</p>	
<p><b>ALDER</b></p>	<p>Alder trees have green bark that becomes brown with age, and have dark green leaves that are shiny on top and dull underneath. They are oval in outline with a toothed margin.</p>	
<p><b>POPLAR</b> -Silver -Gray -Black</p>	<p>The leaves are alternate and ovate or heart-shaped in outline, with finely to coarsely toothed margins</p>
